Coffee Filter Butterfly/Dragonfly

Items you'll need:

Coffee filters

Food coloring

Clothespins

A plate (or sheet plastic)

Paper towels

Googly Eyes (optional)

Pipe cleaners (optional)

Scissors (optional)

Marker (optional)

Directions:

- 1. Get your coffee filter wet and lay it out on a plate (a plate promotes color spreading, whereas if you lay it out on newspaper or a towel, the food coloring will not spread. You can also lay it on sheet plastic). You can fold the filter in half to make the same design on both wings.
- 2. Drop food coloring around the coffee filter and watch it spread! (A little goes a long way)
- 3. When you are satisfied with your design, place the coffee filter on a paper towel and place another paper towel on top of the coffee filter, and pat. This will stop the color from spreading and begin to dry out the coffee filter.
- 4. Place the coffee filter in the sun to dry. (This should only take a few minutes!)
- 5. While the coffee filter is drying, work on the body of your dragonfly/butterfly. Use googly eyes and pipe cleaners to give your bug a face and antennae. (If you don't have these items handy, you can use a marker and paper to make a face and antennae.)
- 6. Gather the coffee filter in the middle and pinch the clothes pin where it is gathered. This makes a butterfly! To make a dragonfly, use scissors to turn the wings on either side of the clothes pin into 2 wings on each side.





Coffee Filter Hot Air Balloons

Items you'll need:

Coffee filters

Food coloring

A plate (or sheet plastic)

Papertowels

Washable Paint

Scissors

Directions:

- 1. Get your coffee filter wet and lay it out on a plate (a plate promotes color spreading, whereas if you lay it out on newspaper or a towel, the food coloring will not spread. You can also lay it on sheet plastic).
- 2. Drop food coloring around the coffee filter and watch it spread! (A little goes a long way)
- 3. When you are satisfied with your design, place the coffee filter on a paper towel and place another paper towel on top of the coffee filter, and pat. This will stop the color from spreading.
- 4. Stick the colored coffee filter to a window or glass door using water.
- 5. Cut clouds out of uncolored coffee filters and get them wet to stick them around the hot air balloon.
- 6. Use washable paint to add the strings and basket to the hot air balloon. (Don't worry, it will wash off the window with soap and water!)
